# HOSTS & HIGHLIGHTS

#### HOSTS

This year, the conference is hosted by several of Arizona's highly rated transplant centers including Mayo Clinic, Banner University Medical Center, St. Joseph's Hospital and Medical Center, and Phoenix Children's Hospital. The program is designed to cover a wide range of topics of general interest to transplant social workers.

#### **PRECONFERENCE**

For the first time, STSW will offer a preconference, on Tuesday, October 10, 2017, from 1:00 - 4:00 pm, that will allow attendees to explore the following topics at greater depth:

- Stress-Reduction/ Mindfulness with Trauma Informed Care with Tamara Rounds, MSW, LCSW
- Using the Stanford Integrated Psychosocial Assessment for Transplantation (SIPAT) to Inform Selection Decision Making with **Jose Maldonado**, **MD**, **FAPM**, **FACFE**

Preconference registration will be available at the same time as the full conference. The rate is \$100 for members and \$150 for non-members.

### PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS

The conference keynote presentation features an innovative surgeon with an appointment in Otorhinolaryngology, Dr. David Lott. He will discuss the future of transplantation and his work with larynx transplants. In addition, we are excited to feature Dr. Walia, transplant director at St. Joseph's Hospital. His session will focus on ethical dilemmas in transplanting the aging population.





Dr. Julie Osborn, Phoenix Children's Hospital resident physician, will discuss the lifelong journey of a pediatric liver transplant patient. This year's conference will offer sessions covering specialties such as pediatric transplant, heart and lung transplant, mechanical circulatory support, living donors, and abdominal transplant, as well as timely topics including diagnosis and treatment of substance use, ethics, and palliative care.

#### TRANSPORTATION & PARKING

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# CONTACT & REGISTRATION

#### REGISTRATION

Registration is now open on the STSW website. Conference registration including the celebration event is \$450 for STSW members and \$650 for non-members. A combined registration and membership is \$550. The one-day rate (excluding annual celebration attendance) is \$200 and student rate for the full conference is \$325. (Students must be enrolled in an approved MSW program.) You can bring a guest to the annual celebration for an additional \$75.

This year is the first year we are offering a preconference for an additional \$100 for members and \$150 for non-members. The preconference offers attendees a more in-depth opportunity to delve into two sessions of intensive training on specific topics. CEUs will be provided for the preconference. We encourage you to take advantage of this opportunity.

Late registration, after September 18, 2017, will be \$50 more. Kosher meals may incur an additional charge. Full refunds, minus PayPal transaction fees, are available until September 6, 2017.



### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

STSW offers a number of scholarships each year, which will cover the registration fee for the STSW conference. Any STSW member with active membership may apply for a scholarship.
