### **Program Highlights**

This year, the conference is hosted by several of Ohio's top rated transplant centers. The program design focuses on offering a multi-faceted approach for all transplant professionals. The keynote presentation features a kidney/pancreas recipient and his journey as a pre- and post-transplant patient. He will share a video documenting his story, as well as the impact his transplant had on his caregivers, family, and the donor's family. In addition, we are excited to be offering an educational session focused on the ethical dilemma regarding death row donation, which will be given by OSU's Comprehensive Transplant Director. Other donation topics that will be explored will be paired kidney donor exchange programs and ethical considerations of altruistic kidney donation. For the first time, we will be featuring an educational panel presentation focused on fundraising for transplant patients, which will be given by Rick Lofgren (COTA CEO), David Bakelman (HelpHOPELive CEO), Connie Gonitzke (NFT CEO) and Laurie McDonald (past STSW president). They will share their expertise on strategies and approaches in helping transplant patients fundraise. Meanwhile, there will be many other exciting topics regarding pediatric transplant, mental health, AOD, and cardiothoracic transplant. Lastly, we will wrap up the 2015 conference with a motivational presentation educating us on the importance on how laughing matters.
